Peter Koniuto, previously Major Gifts Officer at The Foundation for Ellis Medicine, has been named to the role. Koniuto has worked as a philanthropy professional in the Capital Region since 2005, building philanthropic support for programs and operations, with a strong interest in helping donors make a difference in ways that are most meaningful to them.

Currently, BBBSCR serves 450-600 youth each year across Albany, Schenectady, Rensselaer, and Saratoga Counties, with more than one hundred on the waiting list. In addition to the mentoring relationships fostered and supported throughout the year, BBBSCR also operates a site-based program at Union College, The College of St. Rose, The University of Albany, Skidmore College, and RPI. These programs offer the opportunity for college students to offer mentoring and support to children in their community, utilizing the wonderful facilities each campus has to offer.

"We're excited to have Peter join the team and help us achieve our goal of doubling our capacity," said CEO Sabrina Houser. "At BBBSCR we are not just interested in growth but quality, sustainability and most importantly, child safety. It takes time and money to provide the one-on-one support and training we offer our matches and we won't be able to achieve our goal without a true focus on philanthropy. Peter is the perfect person to add our team because he understands our programs, the how and why we work, and he's passionate about what we do. He knows that we need to keep the youth we serve and

Big Brothers Big Sisters of the Capital Region was founded in 1964 and is one of the oldest mentoring programs in the area. It provides children and adolescents with strong, professionally supported, one-to-one mentoring relationships. These relationships help children realize their potential by inspiring their futures, ultimately strengthening their contributions to the community.
