MATCH SPOTLIGHT

ERIN & CHARLOTTE

Erin and Charlotte are part of our site-based program at Skidmore and are our longest site-based match! They were matched two months into Erin's freshman year and three months before Charlotte developed a mysterious (at the time) illness that pulled her out of school for three months while her doctors tried to find an answer. Through all of that, Erin and Charlotte still met for Skidmore programs.

Charlotte's mom said "She was too scared to go anywhere so Erin would bring art supplies to the building at Skidmore where the matches meet and they would stay there for all three hours of program. Then as she slowly got better they would venture out around campus for part of the time and go back when she needed to. At a time when so much of her life was in turmoil, and she was experiencing anxiety as a result, having Erin be so willing to adjust the program to fit Charlotte's needs and remain an upbeat part of her life was invaluable."



Erin is equally effusive about their time together and what being a collegiate Big Sister has meant to her. "As she will be turning 11 this summer, I have had the chance to watch Charlotte grow from a child into a pre-teen, which I rarely get to see as a student teacher. The first couple of times that we met, Charlotte was quite shy. However, throughout the years, I have seen her build many friendships with the other Littles and become a leader.

For me, BBBSCR was one of the most influential extracurriculars of my college career. Charlotte taught me that sometimes all one needs to do to forget about the stresses of college is make a

messy batch (or two, or three) of slime. I would often find myself thinking of how worthwhile this time spent was, compared to the typical college student's Saturday afternoon. Additionally, my advisor recommended that I discuss my work with BBBSCR in my application to teach in Taiwan through Fulbright, and I have recently learned that I am a semi-finalist! If I do move across the world, I will make sure to send Charlotte postcards, and come visit whenever I can."
